	4. The obligation to attend school applies to all students. Students not attending school due to they or a family member being at a high risk of COVID infection must present a Doctor's certificate. The School shall determine the provision of learning activities for students at home when on-campus learning will operate.				
	5. In the event of an acute illness at school children who fall ill must be placed in a separate room and be collected by parents at the earliest possible time. If students show at least one symptom of Coronavirus infection, they shall not be allowed access to the facility until two days after the last occurrence of a symptom.				
	6. Students are taught in grade level classes (K1 to Grade 5) on campus and-grade level classes (Grade 6-12).				
	7. The classification of employees as belonging to a so-called risk group and any protective measures taken by the employer must be determined by the company medical service on request in each individual case. Pregnant staff members will not work on campus. The recommendation of the company medical service is subject to compulsory service. The corresponding duties are regulated as usual by the school management.

10. The school follows the standards of DIN 77400 (Cleaning services for school buildings - requirements for cleaning). It defines principles for contractual, environmentally conscious and hygienic school cleaning. In schools, the focus is on the cleaning of surfaces. Routine surface disinfection in schools is not recommended by the RKI in the current COVID pandemic. If disinfection is considered necessary in individual cases, it will generally be carried out as wipe disinfection with a cold solution. This will be carried out by cleaning staff (School Campus) or school staff (Preschool). A thorough daily cleaning is sufficient. The RKI recommends that it is not necessary to use disinfectant solution.
11. Sufficient liquid soap dispensers and disposable towels will be provided in all toilet rooms and classrooms with sinks and are refilled regularly. The appropriate collection containers for disposable towels and toilet paper will be provided.

Notification procedure in cases of actual or	The most recent guidance on notification in cases of illness or suspected illness are:
suspected Coronavirus infection	1. Staff, teachers and other persons employed or engaged by the school, even temporarily, who show any one symptom of SARS-CoV-2 infection (e.g., shortness of breath, new-onset cough, severe cold, fever, and loss of smell or taste) shall report this immediately to the relevant Principal, and not attend campus duties and arrange a test for SARS-CoV-2 (antigen quick test or PCR test).
	2. Persons employed at or working on the premises are obliged to inform the relevant Principal without delay if they are attending school that is proven to be infected with SARS-CoV-2.
	3. If a person wishing to enter or is present in a DIS school campus shows symptoms of SARS-CoV-2 infection he/she can be refused access to the facility or requested to leave. Students who show symptoms during lessons, school care or other school events shall be accommodated in the First Aid Room (School Campus) and the Main Office (Preschool Campus). Parents or an authorised person shall arrange to collect the child without delay.

	<b>PK1 to K5:</b> In the event of a positive corona case, only the student in question will be isolated at home. Quarantine of other asymptomatic children and teachers in the group is not necessary.
	Grade 1 to Grade 6: In the event of a positive corona case, only the student concerned is isolated.
	Grade 7 to Grade 12: In the event of a positive corona case, only the student in question will be isolated at home.

Short-term encounters (<15min, mainly with distance >1.5m and ventilation) indoors with other children, e.g. in sanitary facilities, pose a low risk with regard to transmission. In outdoor areas, mixing also poses a low risk.
Information to parents: Parents of a class or daycare (group) in which a student/child has tested positive for Corona will be informed of a suspected Corona case.

Personal Hygiene	The novel coronavirus is transmissible from person to person. The main transmission route is droplet infection. This occurs mainly directly via the mucous membranes of the respiratory tract. In addition, transmission is also possible indirectly via hands, which are then brought into contact with the mucous membranes of the mouth or nose and the conjunctiva of the eyes.
	The most important measures are:
	- Avoid touching the face as much as possible, especially the mucous membranes, with your hands, i.e., do not touch the mouth, eyes, or nose.
	- Touching, hugging, or shaking hands with other persons is to be avoided.
	<ul> <li>Thorough hand hygiene (e.g., it is advised after entering school, before and after eating, before and after going to the toilet, and before putting on and taking off a protective mask). Hand hygiene is achieved by:</li> <li>a) washing hands with soap for 20-30 seconds in school washroom areas or classrooms (see also https://www.infektionsschutz.de/haendewaschen/) or, if not possible,</li> </ul>
	b) hand disinfection available in public areas for staff and visitors only.
	- If possible, do not touch publicly accessible objects such as door handles with your full hand or fingers; use elbows if necessary.
	- When coughing and sneezing, the mouth and nose must be covered with bent elbows or paper tissues; the used tissues must be disposed of (for example in a small plastic bag brought along to the work areas or in designated waste containers). When coughing or sneezing, keep the greatest possible distance from other people and preferably turn away.

Masks	<b>Note</b> : The State of Saxony requires wearing a mask (mouth-nose-cover or MNB) in general in certain situations e.g. public transport. The risk of infecting another person by coughing, sneezing or speaking can be reduced in this way.
	The wearing of masks in school by students, staff and parents is no longer compulsory. The wearing of a mask is still recommended.
	FFP2 masks and disposable medical masks are available in the divisional School Offices for teachers and office staff who require them at any time. There is a two-hour limit on the use of disposable medical masks but the FFP2 masks can be worn for a maximum time of 75 mins before a break of 30 mins.
