

- Three interrelated IB programmes that promote international thinking and tolerance:
 - Primary Years Programme (PYP) = Grades 1-5
 - Middle Years Programme (MYP) = Grades 6-10
 - Diploma Programme (DP) = Grades 11 & 12
- Holistically oriented education with a focus on creative and critical thinking, problem solving and the ability to communicate competently with others
- Interdisciplinary, i.e. the topics taught are interdisciplinary
- Promotes responsible action in dealing with other cultures and traditions

Secondary School Overview

Grades 6-12

- School times: 8:30-14:45/15:45
- "Bring Your Own Device"
- Student-Parent-Teacher Conferences and continuous assessment with marks from 1-7
- Student support programme including: counsellor, learning specialist team, careers counselling
- Various co-curricular for all grade levels
- Focus on various trips such as some field trips
- Regular communication with parents through Managebac



Secondary School

Grades 6-12

- Holistic education: academic, social and personal
- Assessment throughout is criterion referenced and feedback is offered on an ongoing basis
- Can respond to students' individual needs because of small classes, support from guidance teacher, school counsellor and special needs teacher
- All care is taken to ensure that student study choices allow them to fulfill the requirements of the *Realschulabschluss* and the *Abitur* if needed.





Middle Years Programme Grade 6-10

IB Middle Years Programme (MYP)

Taught in Grades 6 to 10



A curriculum that encourages young people to connect academic learning with the world around them. Content and skills are explicitly taught as well as the conceptual basis underpinning all learning. This allows young people to understand the 'why' as well as the 'what' of their learning.

It is a tailored programme for social and emotional well-being and approaches to learning.



Language Support



Middle Years Programme

- English as Additional Language is available for beginners and extra support is provided for learners who need help with academic English.
- Student Learning Support team provides specialist help for a range of student needs.
- German and English is offered at home language level, or as an additional language depending on students' level of experience.
- German speakers are encouraged to study German at a high level and to continue to use their German at home, as it is through mother tongue that high level conceptual thinking can take place.
- Unless students are in the learning support classes or in the EAL classes, they will learn a third language, which is Spanish.
- We support students in learning their home languages.



Special Aspects - Grades 6-10

Grades 6-10



- Service as Action and Personal Project are an essential part of the MYP
- We have a range of trips on offer. Trips tend to be local and we also offer some residential field trips. Our trips can include:
 - day trips to museums, theaters and sporting events across the country
 - residential trips to Krakow, North Sea, Berlin
 - outdoors trips to foster teamwork and collaboration



Service as Action - Grades 6-10

Students engage in **service** learning in order to

- develop their own strengths and develop their areas for growth
- undertake challenges that help them develop new skills
- discuss, evaluate and plan student-initiated activities
- persevere in action
- work **collaboratively** with others
- develop **international-mindedness** through global engagement, multilingualism and **intercultural understanding**
- consider the ethical implications of their actions

All of these learning outcomes are closely associated with IB learner profile attributes and Approaches To Learning skills. Through their participation in service, students can become more confident, independent, self-regulated learners.



Examples of service as action engagements:

- Writing original picture books to teach a lesson
- (Re)designing a community website
- Organize an activity to raise awareness for Earth Day or Neurodiversity Week
- Campaign for more bike lanes in your town
- Raise awareness and share knowledge about internet safety
- Perform a concert or play at a senior center
- Organize a reading hour for children at a local school or library



Personal Project - Grade 10 only



- Culminating project for MYP
- Students follow an area of particular interest
- Individual supervisors
- Product, a portfolio of learning experiences and a report

Students demonstrate independence, organisation skills, capacity for sustaining long-term projects, capacity for reflection.

Examples of Personal Projects

- Writing a book
- Designing and making jewelry
- Forming a debating club
- Building an instrument from scratch
- Creating software programs
- Remodeling using eco-friendly material



Bring Your Own Device (BYOD)

from Grade 6



Students in Grade 5 often use DIS technology (Ipads and Chromebooks) so the transition to using technology from Grade 6 is much more natural.

BYOD Device Specifications:

We recommend the use of Chromebooks in the school from Grade 6. Any Chromebook less than three years old is suitable. We will also be able to support Windows 10 and MacOSX Mojave and higher.



How do students use technology?

Writing and using hands and voices to learn is still really important!

Laptops and internet allow students access to:

- Different learning tools, such as voice to text and subtitles
- Quick access to (high quality) research and information
- Communication tools and skills they will need for their adult lives
- Regularly updated textbooks and materials
- The world around them through images, film, sound and text.

Diploma Programme Grade 11-12

Diploma Programme

IB Diploma Programme (DP) Grades 11 and 12



- Students have the opportunity to undertake either the full IB
 Diploma Programme or a modified version which leads to the
 High School Diploma
- Students select one subject from each group, choosing three at higher level and three at standard level.
- Additionally:
 - Extended Essay
 - Creativity, Activity, Service (CAS Programme)
 - Theory of Knowledge (a course in critical thinking)
- Programme can be modified depending on student's academic needs and future study pathways.



Qualifications

Recognised worldwide (including Germany)

IB Diploma

- Obtained at the end of Grade 12
- Recognized as Abitur. However, a certain combination of subjects is a prerequisite

DIS High School Diploma

- Grade 12 (entitles you to study in the USA and some European universities)
- Recognised as *Realschulabschluss*

MYP Certificate

- Obtained at the end of Grade 10
- Recognised as *Realschulabschluss*



Results IB Exams

Class of 2023 > 27 IB Candidates (28 Graduates)

DIS Success Rate = 89 % worldwide success rate = 79 %

DIS Average Points = 31 (max. 45) worldwide average = 30

Highest Points Achieved: 41 von 45 (= 1.1 Abitur)

DIS Bilingual Diploma = 67 % worldwide average = 23 %

Admissions Process

Admissions Process

Schedule a conversation and a school tour with our Admissions Coordinator to get to know the school and our programmes!

- 1) Submit the required documents (incl. photo, report cards, other documents)
- 2) Document review and forwarding to relevant school section
- 3) Interview with School Principal (Primary or Secondary School)
- 4) Admissions tests according to age/grade
 - Preschool Grade 5: cognitive, academic tests
- Grades 6 12: German, Maths, English (where applicable, advanced English test WIDA)
- 5) Decision is made within two weeks after the interview
- 6) Sign contract Welcome at DIS!

Registration fee annually for the first three years at DIS **1.600,00 €**

Dependant on grade level

Example calculations for Grade 6

School fee = 1.440,00 euro

Sponsoring fee = 13.125,00 euros *Fee reduction is possible*

Registration fee = 1.600,00 euros* *Fee reduction is possible* *only for the first three years

Total = 16.165,00 euros

Fee Reduction

School provides financial aid for families who apply. Fee reduction is calculated individually based on household income.
