The role involves push in and small group support, working with students who have a diverse range of needs.

The role is 16 hours a week, 40% FTE

Profile:

- The learning support (LS) teacher will work with children from Grades 6 to 12 who need extra support and/or challenge in order to reach their full educational potential. The LS teacher will collaborate with teachers and educational leaders to ensure that the curriculum is accessible and inclusive for all students.
- The learning support teacher will work with learners who are neurodivergent, for example with cognitive variables such as Autism, ADHD, and Dyslexia as well as supporting students whose learning, attention, sociability, and mood may be more divergent than is typical.
- A key aspect of working in this field is identifying individual needs and being responsible for creating a safe, stimulating, and supportive learning environment.

A learning support teacher is expected to:



- teach either individuals or small groups of students within, or outside, the class
- prepare lessons and resources
- assess work, offer feedback, maintain accurate data and report on student progress
- collaborate with subject teachers to develop inclusive teaching materials and pedagogy to meet the individual needs of students.
- be an ambassador for the use of multimedia and other technologies within teaching and learning
- observe and assess children who have been referred to the Student Support Services Team and work with colleagues to identify individual student needs
- liaise with other professionals, such as social workers, speech and language therapists, physiotherapists, and educational psychologists as required
- · work closely with parents and guardians
- organize learning outside the classroom in activities such as community visits, school outings or sporting events
- carry out administrative tasks, including updating and maintaining records of students' progress
- attend professional training courses to maintain and develop teaching skills in learning support manage student behavior
- carry out the other roles and responsibilities of a Secondary school teacher, including duties and being responsible for an extended advisory group.
